## First Reading: Isaiah 35:4-7a

Isaiah tells the people to be strong and unafraid. God will save his people, and the blind will see, the deaf will hear, and the lame will walk. Streams will come forth in the desert, the sandy ground will become springs of water.

## Second Reading: James 2:1-5

James encourages the people to never show favoritism. He discusses an usher who escorted a rich man to the best seat, while ignoring a poor man. God chose poor people to be rich in faith, so we should never judge people by their riches.

## Gospel: Mark 7:31-37

Some people brought a deaf man who could not speak to Jesus and begged him to lay his hand on the man. Jesus opened the man's ears and cured his speech impediment. He ordered the people not to tell anyone, but they were too amazed to keep this to themselves.

## SOCIAL CONCERNS PROGRAMS of St. John the Apostle *How YOU can help...*

SANDWICH PROGRAM - Dating back 40+ years there have been many groups of volunteers in the parish that met every week to make sandwiches and deliver them to Newark. Approximately 30 loaves of sandwiches were delivered each week. This program had continued until the pandemic. During the pandemic, a group of Social Concerns members made 60 loaves of P&J sandwiches which during that time were delivered to St. John's in Newark. The sandwich program is due to begin again in September. The funds for this program come from St. John's Social Concerns.

There is a parish-wide collection of sandwiches, fruit box drinks and cases of water collected on the 4th Friday of each month. Sandwiches are made by parishioners and individually wrapped. Sandwiches/ fruit box drinks/water are brought to the rectory on the parking lot side by 9 a.m. on the 4th Friday. A member of Social Concerns picks up and delivers these items to St. John's in Newark for distribution.

**ST. JOSEPH'S SOUP KITCHEN -** When there are 5 Saturdays within the month, St. John's goes to St. Joseph's Social Services Center in Elizabeth and serves a hot meal. The hot lunch includes meatloaf, gravy, mashed potatoes, vegetables, butter bread and cookies. Our parishioners prepare and serve the meals. The funds for the preparation of these meals come from St. John's Social Concerns.

FRUIT BASKETS FOR ELDERLY OF THE PARISH - The week before Thanksgiving,

Social Concerns assemble approximately 75-80 baskets of fruit for the elderly/shut-ins of our parish. Volunteers deliver the baskets the weekend before Thanksgiving. The funds for this program come from donations as well as from St. John's Social Concerns.

**GIVING TREE -** The Giving Tree is put up in the sanctuary in the mid-November. Gift tags are placed on the tree for the parishioners to take and purchase the gifts for those in need. The unwrapped gifts are sorted by St. Joseph's volunteers for distribution to individual families. St. Joseph's Social Service Center is the main recipient of these gifts for distribution to over 200 families.



And the people brought to Him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged Him to lay His hand on him.

We read in today's first reading from Isaiah: "*Here is your God, He comes with vindication; with divine recompense, He comes to save you. Then will...the ears of the deaf be cleared...the tongue of the mute will sing.*" Isaiah's prophecy of the coming of the Messiah is fulfilled in Jesus Christ, as we read in today's gospel.

However, when we reflect on the miracle of the deaf and mute man being able to hear and speak, we may wonder why did Jesus take him away from the crowd? Why does Mark give us the details on the manner in which Jesus chose to heal this man?

Some Scripture scholars tell us that Jesus removed the man from the crowd to avoid making a public spectacle. The man being deaf and mute must have felt isolated from the rest of society – not being able to communicate. Jesus understands and is sensitive to the man's circumstances.

Further, Scripture scholars suggest that there was a dual healing...Jesus not only opens the man's ears to hear and his tongue to speak, but opens his heart to know Him, as his Lord and God. Jesus' words: *"Be opened"* surely can apply to us as well. While most of us can hear and speak, we need to always be listening to Jesus Christ and be speaking with Him!

The people brought the deaf and mute man to Jesus. We don't know if the man requested to see Jesus or if they were acting out of compassion. What is most important is that he got to Jesus...so whether we reach out to Jesus on our own or someone intervenes for us – the result is the same, we encounter Jesus Christ. Think for a moment on how you became involved in a particular ministry or organization or activity in the parish...many times, someone invited us to help, to join. Maybe we feel inspired to invite someone.

Sometimes this invitation comes in the silence of our hearts and mind – we have a sense that it is Jesus inviting us. Here's an example...when the Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration was starting at St. John's, in listening to the homily that invitation weekend (25 years ago), I felt that Jesus was inviting me to join Him for an hour in the middle of the night...so I signed up for the 3 a.m. Sunday hour – knowing in my heart that I had to respond "yes" to this invitation.

Other times, we hear and listen to Jesus' call to change, to turn away from sin, to seek Him in His mercy. When we listen to Jesus and pay attention to Him speaking to us – then we can respond "yes" to Him. We pray: "Be opened," that Jesus will open our minds to know Him and His will for us, our hearts to love Him and our lips to be His voice in the world in which we live, our home, family, workplace, school, community...everywhere!
