


Spotlight on the Gospel In 2:13-25

In those days, God delivered all these commandments... The ten commandments described in today's reading from the Book of Exodus are far from being a set of rules designed to impede our freedom. Rather they are laws of love, written in the language of God – love! The commandments are an opportunity for us to demonstrate our love for God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We can see them as opportunities to grow closer to God, to live in a right relationship with God and our neighbor. They apply to all times and circumstances. During Lent we reflect on how we have fallen short of our covenant with God – a covenant forged at our Baptism.

In today's gospel, Jesus links the temple with His body. Jesus answered and said to them: Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up. What will Jesus find in the temple of our hearts and minds? What have we filled our temple with? Let's not wait for Jesus to come into our temple to drive out the things which caused us to break our covenant with Him. Let's seek Jesus Christ in His mercy, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, this Lent and throughout our lives. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all...The people in today's gospel preferred the riches of God, rather than a relationship with God. Today's gospel speaks to us about the essence of Lent – a call to genuine conversion.

LENT SPOTLIGHT

Lent, the period of 40 days that precedes the celebration of Easter, has its origin in the early days of the Church. Converts seeking to become Christian, who at that time were mostly adults, spent several years in study and preparation. Under the threat of Roman persecution, becoming a Christian was serious business, so their process of preparation was intensive! Then they went through a final period of "purification and enlightenment" for the 40 days before their baptism at Easter. The rest of the Church began to observe the season of Lent in solidarity with these newest Christians. It became an opportunity for all Christians to recall and renew the commitment of their baptism.

Today we know Lent as a season of conversion: We acknowledge the ways we have turned away from God in our lives, and We focus on turning our hearts and minds back toward God. Hence the three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These observances help us turn away from whatever has distracted or derailed us and to turn back to God. Giving up something for Lent is ultimately a form of fasting. We can deprive ourselves of some small pleasure or indulgence and offer that sacrifice up to God. Or we can even take on something that we can use to bring us closer to the Lord.

What is a Holy Hour?

In the Catholic world, "holy hour" usually refers to an hour devoted to Adoration of the Eucharist. Adoration is a form of prayer that began many centuries ago. Adoration means "to pay honor or homage to someone or something." In this case, we are honoring and worshipping Jesus, who we believe is truly and fully present in the Eucharist.

What happens during a Holy Hour?

At our holy hours, you can choose to spend the time in prayer, reading the Bible or a spiritual book if you have one, journaling, praying the Rosary, or engage in that time of prayer however you feel drawn to.

During Adoration...

- We have the opportunity to come face-to-face with God!
- We are spending time with a friend.
- We get to deepen and strengthen our personal relationship with God.
- We can spend time setting aside the worries and stresses of the week and simply be in the peaceful presence of God.

If you've never been to Adoration before, we encourage you to give it a try - Lent is a great season to discover new ways to grow in our prayer lives. Many people who have tried this form of prayer say that it is a peaceful and restorative experience like nothing else!
