Spotlight on the Gospel Jn 15: 9-17

Last Sunday, Jesus taught that as his disciples, we are connected to him like branches on a vine. This Sunday, Jesus goes even deeper. Jesus tells us in today' gospel that the greatest self-giving is to "lay down one's life for one's friends, as he did for us. Jesus not only provided the example of love by his death, but establishes the foundation for love among all disciples through the centuries. Jesus' laying down his life for us in the ultimate sign of his love for us. "Jesus said to is disciples: As the Father loves me, so I also love you." So we see that Jesus loves us with the same love that the Father loves him. Jesus goes on in a similar fashion regarding keeping the commandments. "If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love." Jesus' response to the Father's love is in obedience to the Father's commandments. Likewise, our response to Jesus' love must be in obedience to the commandments. The commandments are not burdens, but our obedience is a loving response to Jesus Christ.

The idea of being a friend of God has greater meaning when we understand that in the courts of Roman emperors and eastern kings, there was a very select group of men, called friends of the king or friends of the emperor. At all times they had access to the king. He talked to them before he talked to his generals, rulers and statesmen. The friends of the king were those who had the closest and most intimate connection with him. Just think of it...we are in the inner circle of friends of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Our response to Jesus command to "love one another"... we give of what God gave to us...our time...our abilities...our money... While all of us don't have or can give large amounts of money, we all have time and abilities to give.




Online Giving
